

Natural Features (Part of our Needs Assessment Chapter)

As were the Target Features, Natural Features are also considered risks by the Committee. They too are presented with brief narratives and, in some cases, supported by accompanying data to quantify emergency response and/or measure the emergency response. Response experience is again useful to gauge the probability of adverse exposures related to the feature. **Table _____** follows the narratives with a graphic, summary account of these features, the exposures they present and the emergency resource response capabilities defined by the Committee. Natural Features are:
