Engine: 365
 The primary fire engine for the Mendon Fire Dist. is a 2012 Spartan Rosenbauer engine with a 1500 gpm pump and 2000' of 5"inch supply hose. This engine responds first out to all fire alarms, The engines primary focus is fire suppression and was designed to be capable of carrying large amounts of water and supply hose, with large compartments for equipment.

Tender: 3617
 This unit was designed to carry 2000 gallons of water to areas of the district that are not serviced by MCWA. The unit carries two portable ponds each capable of holding 2000 gallons, allowing for mutual aid tenders to dump their water into them to help support rural water supply operations.
